Soil Test Fees

Most of the year (generally April through November), routine NCDA&CS soil tests are provided at "no direct cost" to N.C. residents because of funding derived from a statewide fee on commercial fertilizer. However, from now through March, a peak-season fee of \$4 is charged for the processing of each soil sample.



We have soil test kits available 24 hours a day in the message center in our **Demonstration Garden.**
