Purpose

Objectively assess satisfaction with the delivery of County services

Determine priorities for the community based on survey results

Compare the County's performance with past results and benchmarks

Methodology

Survey Description

- 2nd Resident
 Survey conducted
 for the County by
 ETC Institute
- First was conducted in 2021

Method of Administration

- By mail and online to random sample households in the County
- Each survey took approximately 15-20 minutes to complete

Sample Size

- 1,230 completed surveys were collected

- Commissioner
 District B: 801

Margin of Error


- +/- 2.8% at the 95% level of confidence
- Commissioner District A: +/- 4.7%
- Commissioner
 District B: +/- 3.5%

Location of Survey Respondents

Good representation of responses throughout the City

Home address of all respondents are geocoded to the block level to ensure anonymity

In additional to geographic representation, ETC Institute also achieved a good demographic representation in the results



2023 Forsyth County Community Survey Respondent Locations

What to Know

Residents still have a positive perception of the County, but ratings have dropped from 2021

- 2021: 86% rated the County as an "excellent" or "good" place to live
- 2023: 76% rated the County as an "excellent" or "good" place to live

Some of the largest decreases in perceptions and quality of life ratings included:

- As a place where you can find affordable housing (-12.6 pts.)
- As a place where you can earn a living wage (-11.2 pts.)
- As a place to educate children (-10.3 pts.)

Forsyth County is not experiencing these drops in isolation

What to Know

Although perception ratings have dropped, the County is still performing well compared to the national average

- Of the 20 areas that were compared to the national average, Forsyth County rated above the average in 15 of the areas (75%)
- The County rated significantly above the average in 13 of the areas (52%)

Top priorities identified through Importance-Satisfaction Analysis remain unchanged from 2021

- Quality of K-12 education buildings
- Communication with the public
- Efforts to ensure the community is prepare for emergencies
- Enforcement of codes and ordinances
- Quality of public health services



by percentage of respondents




There has been a nation shift in terms of perceptions related to quality of life




Rating the County as a Place to Live 2023 and 2021




Rating the County as a Place to Raise Children 2023 and 2021



Q1. Reasons for Living in Forsyth County




Q3. How Important Residents Believe Each of the Following Will Be to the Overall Quality of Life in the County Over the Next 20 Years

Benchmarking Overview

The U.S. Average is developed from a survey administered by ETC Institute during the summer of 2023 to more than 10,000 residents in the U.S.

The County rated above the U.S. Average in 15 of the 20 areas assessed

 Significantly higher ratings were found in 13 of the 20 areas (difference of 5% pts. or more)


The Atlantic Regional Average includes North Carolina, Virginia, West Virginia, Delaware, Maryland, the District of Columbia, and New Jersey

The County rated above the Atlantic Regional Average in 11 of the 20 areas assessed

 Significantly higher ratings were found in 6 of the 20 areas (difference of 5% pts. or more)


Overall Satisfaction Forsyth County vs. Atlantic Region vs. U.S.

by percentage of respondents who rated the item 4 or 5 on a 5-point scale where 5 was "excellent" and 1 was "poor" (excluding don't knows)




Major Categories of Government Services Forsyth County vs. Atlantic Region vs. U.S.


Government Communication Forsyth County vs. Atlantic Region vs. U.S.






Q12. Sources That Households Use to Learn About Forsyth County News, Events, and Other County Information

by percentage of respondents (multiple selections could be made)




Q13. Sources That Residents Most Prefer to Use to Get Information on County News, Events, and Other County Information
