## Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Youth who have prior offenses, have a history of runaway behavior, use or abuse drugs or alcohol, have moderate to serious school behavior problems and who have parents who are unable to supervise their children.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:				
Peer Domain:	Youth who sometimes or regularly associate with delinquent youth $(51\%)$ or who associate with or are gang members $(8.2\%)$ .			
Individual Domain:	Youth who abuse alcohol or drugs, have mental health needs and need further assessment &/or treatment,			
Family Domain:	we a history of victimization and who are in need of temporary out of home placement. bouth who reside in homes where domestic discord or violence is present, who parents have marginal			
School Domain:	parenting skills and have family members with a criminal history. Youth with moderate or serious school behavior problems including unexcused absences, in school			
suspensions, short term suspension(s), long term suspension(s), or have dropped out of school. Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:				
1. Program services co	mpatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.			

2. Program services are outcome-based.

3. The program has an evaluation component.

4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individual, if applicable.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
